Official information request regarding NZ Public Service Data Capability Our Ref: OIA353/1

- 1. I refer to your official information request dated 23 June 2024 for asking for information regarding the data capability of the New Zealand Public Service.
- 2. The answers in response to your request are outlined below.
- 3. Which role within the organisation is responsible for the overall strategic direction of data systems and processes, and at which level (e.g., Tier 1, 2, 3) within the organisation's hierarchy? Please briefly describe the key responsibilities of this role.
 - 3.1 The Deputy Chief Executive Strategy & Corporate is responsible for the overall strategic direction of data systems and processes, and this is a Tier 2 role.
 - 3.2 The position description states "The Deputy Chief Executive Strategy & Corporate supports the Solicitor-General in promoting the vision and leading the strategic direction for the organisation." The relevant Key Result Areas within the position description include:

"Lead Crown Law's strategy

- With the Solicitor-General and senior leadership colleagues lead Crown Law's strategy, particularly as it relates to staffing, financial disciplines, technology and broader Justice sector goals.
- Ensure Crown Law identifies and manages key risks.

Delivery of corporate and legal support functions

- Ensure business services, information, and legal support functions engage with and provide effective support to the legal teams.
- Ensure Crown Law engages and operates in line with all of government initiatives, in particular accommodation, talent development and IT."
